Report details/accomplishments	The Awards Committee met four times by conference call: January 23, March 15, June 25, and July 24 to conduct business. Subcommittees work in between calls on rubrics for the 2018 board approved awards and communicated via email with the entire committee. Major accomplishments included developing the rubrics for the 2018 awards:
	Policy and Service, Mentorship, and Friend of Nursing and conducting the review of applications submitted for these awards. In addition, the Committee recommended the following awards be announced for 2019: Education, Practice, Scholarship, and Hall of Fame. These recommendations were approved by the ANA-NY Board.
	The Committee also faced a few challenges this past year, which we believe it is important to share with the membership:
	1. Applications submitted for awards were usually incomplete, i.e., nominators and nominees did not submit required documentation. Therefore, the Executive Director had to follow-up with several individuals to request additional application materials. Since this was the first go around for these awards, committee members recommended leniency. That is, they reviewed all applications whether or not complete. This will not be the case going forward. Applications for any award must be complete as per published criteria or they will not be considered.
	2. Another challenge was the need to find external reviewers for the Mentorship Award applications because three of the committee members had to recuse themselves due to a conflict of interest. Therefore, both the Executive Director and Committee Chair sought outside reviewers for those applications. We are indebted to the following individuals who stepped up to the plate so to speak:
