Report details/accomplishments

The committee has addressed and discussed various issues, including:

1. Project Firstline and how to use it in nursing education programs. Feedback is shared monthly to assist other faculty members.
2. The new BS Standards as developed by AACN.
3. The possibility of including New York State as part of the NCSBN Nursing Compact was discussed at the request of the NSANYS board. The NEC committee gave the student representatives feedback and background information on the current status of the NCSBN Nursing Compact in NY State. The NSANYS board was requesting our support for the recent NSNA resolution passed at the April 2022 NSNA HOD and for a resolution that NSANYS hopes to pass at the state level.
4. Diversity, equity and inclusion as applied to nursing education programs. NEC committee members discussed what strategies and activities are being implemented within different nursing programs.
5. The committee members began a white paper in support of nurse intern programs for new graduate nurses.
6. Suzanne Sullivan, the Executive Secretary of the State Board for Nursing, attended the March meeting to engage in dialogue about current issues affecting nurse educators.
7. The committee submitted 4 continuing education articles for the ANA-NY newsletter.
8. Several committee members participated with members from the program committee in the review of posters and podium presentations that were submitted for the annual convention and accepted those that addressed the convention theme most appropriately.
